# Acer palmatum 'Bloodgood' MS #7 (Japanese Maple) small, multi-stemmed, upright tree with dark red lobed leaves turning scarlet in fall; best in a partially shaded, protected location; 15-20' tall and wide; Zone 5 -----	238.00
# Acer palmatum 'Bloodgood' SS #6 (Japanese Maple) small, upright tree with dark red lobed leaves turning scarlet in fall; best in a partially shaded, protected location; 15-20' tall and wide; Zone 5 -----	148.00

* Acer tatarian Hot Wings® #10 (Tatarian Maple) a superior, small ornamental tree; bright red samaras (helicopters) produce Christmas in July; sun to part shade; 15-18' tall and wide; Zone 4 -----	198.00
Acer trun. x plat. Crimson Sunset® #20 (Hybrid Maple) deep purple foliage all season on a strong hybrid, a little smaller than 'Crimson King'; sun; 35' tall; spread 25'; Zone 4-----	360.00

Azalea 'Lemon Lights' #2 (Hardy Azalea) a prolific bloomer with bright lemon-yellow flowers; from the University of Minnesota breeding program; best in part shade; 6 feet; Zone 4 -----	48.00
Azalea 'Mandarin Lights' #2 (Hardy Azalea) mildly fragrant, bright reddish-orange flowers; upright, rounded habit; very hardy; 6'; Zone 4 -----	48.00
Azalea 'Rosy Lights' #2 (Hardy Azalea) pretty rose-pink flower clusters; large, twisted leaves with bronze cast to new growth; part shade; 5' tall and wide; Zone 4 -----	48.00
* Berberis thunbergii Crimson Cutie® #2 (Barberry) non-invasive form of dwarf red barberry with tiny red leaves and dense branching; orange-red fall color; 2' tall; 2-3' wide; Zone 4 -----	48.00
* Berberis thunbergii Sunjoy® Mini Maroon #3 (Dwarf Barberry) deep purple-red foliage on a seedless dwarf, growing to 2-3' tall and wide; needs little to no pruning to stay small; sun; Zone 4 -----	48.00
Betula jacquemontii 'Tickle Creek' #6 (Dwarf White Birch) lacy, deeply cut leaves on a slow growing dwarf birch; white twigs turn to copper in second season; trunk and branches turn white with age; sun; 6' tall x 4' wide; Zone 4 --	248.00
# Betula nigra Heritage® CL #7 (Clump River Birch) light green, glossy foliage, turning yellow in fall; wonderful, exfoliating bark is light tan; 40' tall; spread 30'; Zone 4 -----	162.00
Betula nigra 'Little King' MS #25 (Dwarf River Birch) a.k.a. Fox Valley; a dwarf selection of river birch with cinnamon and cream exfoliating bark; great for smaller landscapes; sun to part shade; 8-10' tall; Zone 4 -----	398.00
Betula nigra 'Shiloh Splash' #7 (Variegated River Birch) green and white varigated, glossy foliage; wonderful, exfoliating bark is light tan; 10' tall; spread 8'; Zone 5 -----	148.00

* Betula x plettkei Cesky Gold® #3 (Dwarf Birch) hardy and deer resistant dwarf; foliage sports sunset hues in spring, then turns chartreuse; fan shaped growth, or can be pruned to shape; sun; 2-4' tall; 2-3' wide; Zone 2 -----	58.00
# Buxus Chicagoland Green® #3 (Boxwood) one tough boxwood; resists burning, even in full sun; medium green; grows to 3' tall and 5' wide; sun or shade; Zone 4 -----	58.00

Buxus 'Green Velvet' #3 (Boxwood) a compact, rounded plant with outstanding hardiness and dark glossy leaves; sun to shade; 3' tall and wide; Zone 5 -----	58.00
Buxus microphylla Sprinter® (Boxwood) fast growing, evergreen, deer resistant plant for sun or shade; makes good low hedge; 3-4' tall and wide; Zone 5 -----	58.00
* Buxus sinica insularis 'Wee Willie' #1 (Dwarf Korean Boxwood) cute, dark green, hardy dwarf, growing only 2' tall and wide; perfect for low hedge or along walkways; sun to part shade; Zone 5 -----	38.00
# Callicarpa dichotoma 'Early Amethyst' #5 (Beautyberry) a.k.a. 'Issai'; bright purple berries appear in early fall; full sun; interesting smaller shrub; 3-4 feet tall; Zone 5 -----	54.00
Callicarpa Pearl Glam® #3 (Beautyberry) attractive purple foliage all summer; white flowers in spring; large, violet berries in fall; sun; 4-5' tall and wide; Zone 5 -----	58.00

# Cercidiphyllum japonicum MS #10 (Katsura Tree) lovely and elegant tree; foliage emerges a bronzy purple, fading to light green, then blue-green; apricot yellow in fall; 40' tall and wide; Zone 4-----	238.00

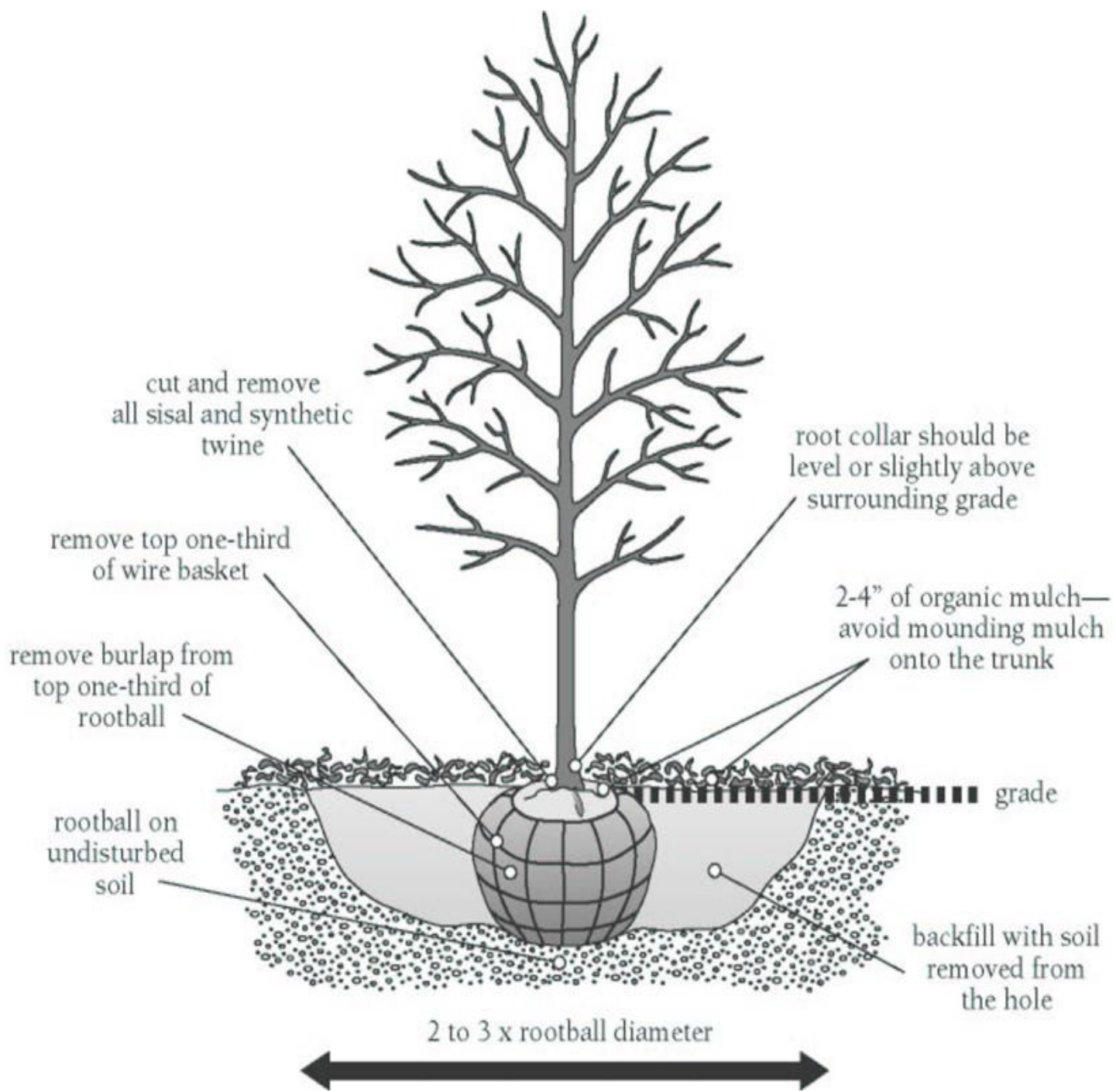

The most common mistake when planting a tree is digging a hole which is both too deep and too narrow. As a general rule, trees should be transplanted no deeper than the soil in which they were originally grown. Too deep and the roots don't have access to sufficient oxygen to ensure proper growth. Trees planted too deeply tend to go into decline in a few years. Measure the height of your root ball carefully, and dig the hole at that same depth, so that the root ball will sit on firm ground (not soft, backfilled soil). Too narrow and the root structure can't expand sufficiently to nourish and properly anchor the tree, and you may have trouble maneuvering the root ball into the position you want.

The width of the hole should be around two times the diameter of the root ball or container or the spread of the roots in the case of bare root trees. This will provide the tree with enough worked earth for its root structure to establish itself. The root flare at the bottom of the trunk should be noticeable above ground. Avoid the "telephone pole" look, where the trunk comes out of the ground as straight as a telephone pole. If planting a container grown tree, and the tree seems especially root bound, with roots circling round and round, you should score the sides of the root ball by cutting vertically down the sides with a knife in two or three places, and butterfly the bottom of the root ball with crisscrossing cuts.

Backfill with the same soil that you removed when you dug the hole. If you feel the need to amend the soil, mix in a little compost, but not too much. You don't want the soil in the hole to be substantially different than the surrounding soil, or else your tree site may be a spot that either dries out faster than the surrounding soil or stays too wet. Backfill soil is then placed in the hole surrounding the tree just to the height of the ball or slightly lower to allow for some settling. Toss in some **organic fertilizer** as you backfill. Firm in the backfill soil with your heel to hold the tree in place. Some people like to backfill halfway, **water** that portion in, and then finish backfilling. Keep an eye on the tree during the first few weeks to make sure that it stays straight. If a wind causes it to tilt, pull it back up and stomp the soil again to hold it firmly. In especially windy areas, staking may be necessary.

Generally, **water** once a week during the first season in order to get the tree established. **Mulching** around the tree, 3 or 4 inches deep in the shape of a doughnut 3 or 4 feet wide, will help hold in moisture, keep weeds down, and keep the lawn mower from hitting the base of the tree.
