- Acer campestre Carnival® #6** (Variegated Hedge Maple) foliage emerges pink, cream and light green and turns to a bright, white and green variegated; prefers sheltered partial shade; 6-8' tall and 4-6' spread; Zone 5 ----- 199.99
- Acer ginnala 'Flame' MS #10** (Amur Maple--multi-stem) small tree with rounded outline; fragrant yellow-white flowers in late April; brilliant rust-red fall color; very hardy and adaptable; full sun to part shade; 20-25'; Zone 3 ----- 149.99
- Acer griseum #7** (Paperbark Maple) dramatically flaking orange-copper bark; massive branches which thicken with age; rich green leaves have brilliant red fall color; native to China; 30-40 feet; spread 15-20 feet; Zone 5 ----- 149.99

<b>Buxus Chicagoland Green® #3</b> (Boxwood) one tough boxwood; resists burning, even in full sun; medium green; grows to 3' tall and 5' wide; sun or shade; Zone 4 -----	49.99

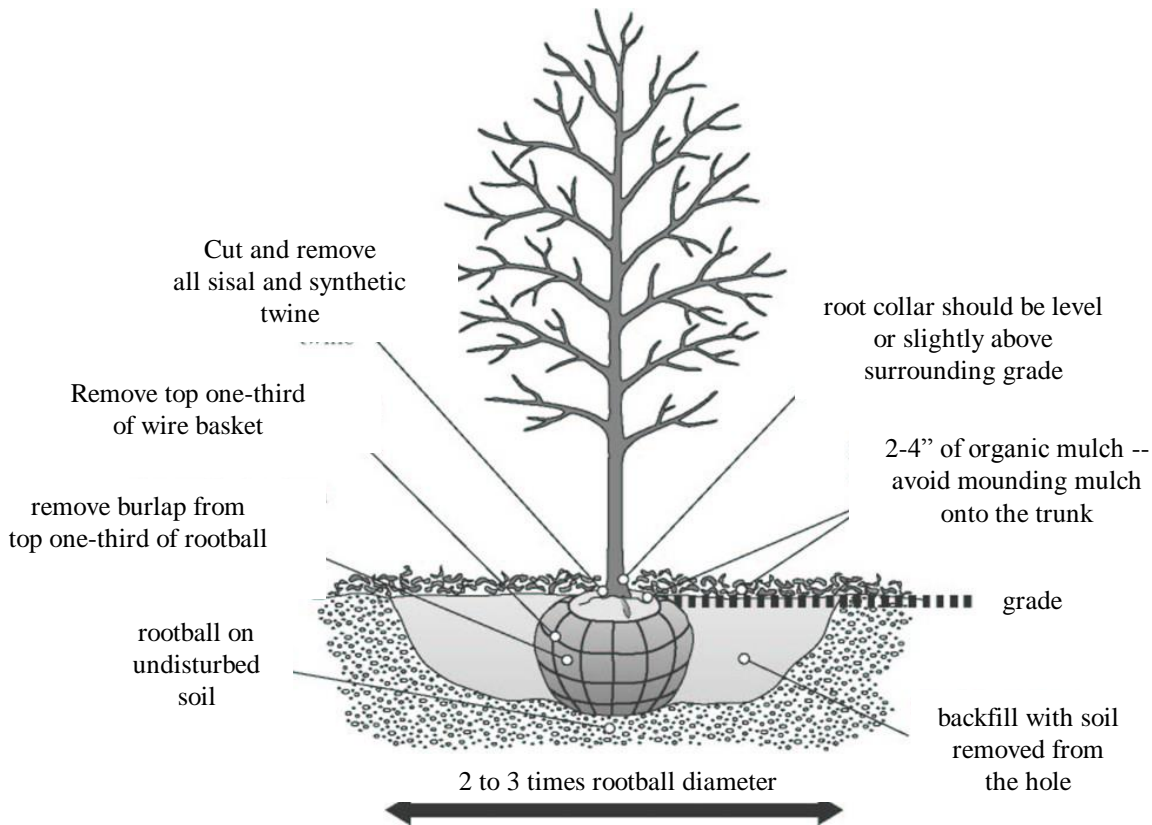

**The most common mistake when planting a tree is digging a hole which is both too deep and too narrow.** As a general rule, trees should be transplanted no deeper than the soil in which they were originally grown. Too deep and the roots don't have access to sufficient oxygen to ensure proper growth. Trees planted too deeply tend to go into decline in a few years. Measure the height of your root ball carefully, and dig the hole at that same depth, so that the root ball will sit on firm ground (not soft, backfilled soil). Too narrow and the root structure can't expand sufficiently to nourish and properly anchor the tree, and you may have trouble maneuvering the root ball into the position you want.

The width of the hole should be around two times the diameter of the root ball or container or the spread of the roots in the case of bare root trees. This will provide the tree with enough worked earth for its root structure to establish itself. The root flare at the bottom of the trunk should be noticeable above ground. Avoid the "telephone pole" look, where the trunk comes out of the ground as straight as a telephone pole. If planting a container grown tree, and the tree seems especially root bound, with roots circling round and round, you should score the sides of the root ball by cutting vertically down the sides with a knife in two or three places, and butterfly the bottom of the root ball with crisscrossing cuts.

Backfill with the same soil that you removed when you dug the hole. If you feel the need to amend the soil, mix in a little compost, but not too much. You don't want the soil in the hole to be substantially different than the surrounding soil, or else your tree site may be a spot that either dries out faster than the surrounding soil or stays too wet. Backfill soil is then placed in the hole surrounding the tree just to the height of the ball or slightly lower to allow for some settling. Toss in some **organic fertilizer** as you backfill. Firm in the backfill soil with your heel to hold the tree in place. Some people like to backfill halfway, **water** that portion in, and then finish backfilling. Keep an eye on the tree during the first few weeks to make sure that it stays straight. If a wind causes it to tilt, pull it back up and stomp the soil again to hold it firmly. In especially windy areas, staking may be necessary.

Generally, **water** once a week during the first season in order to get the tree established. **Mulching** around the tree, 3 or 4 inches deep in the shape of a doughnut 3 or 4 feet wide, will help hold in moisture, keep weeds down, and keep the lawn mower from hitting the base of the tree.
